Praxis: How the Church Practices Its Faith. Hospitality.

In the Gospels, Jesus is always taking something ordinary and making it unique. In **Matthew 25:31-40** he tell us that when we are doing the ordinary things like giving clothes to the needy, feeding someone who is hungry, or visiting someone in prison; that we are doing a significant practice in God's name as unto God himself. **Together as a group read Matthew 25:31-40.**

Throughout the Old and New Testament, God is establishing a practice of radical sharing and generosity. He is always making room for the "common good" amongst his covenant people.

- Have someone read Acts 2:42-46 and another read Romans 12:9-13.
- To what Christian living instructions does the writer make hospitality equal too?
- What kinds of things get in the way of taking hospitality seriously in our own lives?

How we invite others into our lives is a mark of His presence in our lives. We are called to make room for others, because God made room for us.

- How do we overcome our own inherited personality, when it is tempting to use it as an excuse to not be kind and hospitable?
- Why does opening our homes and time to others require an emotional toll?
- Where have you see this being done well in the lives of others?
- What about their practice is worth emulating in your own life?
