Praxis: Worship

Central to the life of a follower of Jesus is the idea and action of worship. Worship is something we do, a way we live, not something we attend and observe.

• In a safe, non-critical manner, share what your preference is when it comes to music in church?

There is nothing wrong with our preferences, but our preferences shouldn't define worship. Worship is ultimately not about us at all, it always has been and always will be only about God.

- How would you define worship?
- In what ways does worship deflect attention away from ourselves?

As a group read together from **John 4:19-24**. Reread verses 23 and 24 for added emphasis.

- What kind of worshipper is Jesus talking about in this passage?
- How do we practice the act of worship collectively?
- Which of the corporate practices of worship is the hardest for you to participate in?

We give, we live, we hope, we share, we encourage, we serve, we endure, we parent, we work, we play and all of it is our worship to the Lord.

In what ways have you discovered the statement above to be true in your own life?

Our lives will be a reflection of our worship, for better or for worse. What we are worshipping to (responding too) will shape who we are and the choices we ultimately make.

When have you discovered your life centered on worshipping something that wasn't God?

In closing read **1 Chronicles 16:7-27** as a group and pray together that God would help us life a life that reflects David's prayer in this passage.
