Praxis: Preaching

We can't divorce what we believe from what we do. The most central thing that the local church can do in its gatherings is to hear from God though the preaching of the Bible.

- What is the most memorable sermon you've ever heard and what made it memorable to you?
- What makes a sermon "good" in your own opinion?

Together as a group read **Romans 10:11-17**, reading it through together from a few different translations to gain a better understanding.

• What is your understanding of Romans 10:17? What do you think it means?

God is a speaking God. His words spoke the world into existence and through the Bible his words continue to be an incredibly active part of His kingdom.

- When have you felt that God was directly speaking to you through a Sunday Morning sermon?
- Why do our hearts need spoken too through outside voices?
- How does a sermon serve as God's voice in our life?

Those that share God's Word carry the good news with them. The good news that something has already been done, that God loves you, and that there is nothing left for us to do for him.

- What are the dangers of moral instructions without the Gospel?
- How do we discover what God is like through the preaching of His Word?

Have someone in the group read **Acts 2:37-41**; the account of a response to Peter's sermon.

- How do we posture our hearts to be willing to change as a response to God's Voice?
- Where are you being challenged to believe something about God that you didn't believe before?
