Places to Engage in our Church:

FRONTLINE TEAM

Parking Team- These are the first faces of Grace. They are warm welcomers who do their part to help families get safely into the building. Their tasks include walking someone in with an umbrella, assisting with traffic flow and bringing people closer to the facility using a golf cart.

Door Greeters- We have greeters as you enter the building and as you enter the auditorium for worship. They are there to offer a smile and warm welcome to those who attend Grace each week.

Info Table Hosts- These volunteers help get new families children registered and escorted to their classes as well as answer any questions about upcoming events (don't worry you don't have to know all the answers, we'll train you and equip you to pass along the information needed).

Check In Hosts -These volunteers welcome families at check-in on Sundays and assist in printing tags for their children who're attending our kids ministry.

Ushers- Our ushers assist guests in finding seats on a Sunday morning as well as help to pass offering and communion during our services.

Security Team-The security team helps make ensure that Grace is a safe place for all attenders by keeping a watchful eye on our kids' environments each Sunday.

CHILDRENS MINISTRY

Wonder Warehouse: This is our infant through Pre-K environments. We are looking for teachers, assistants and worship leaders.

Discovery Central: DC is all about elementary kids, Kindergarten through 2nd grade. We are looking for people comfortable in both small groups of kids or maybe even leading in front of large groups.

Revolve: This is our 3rd through 5th grade destination for fun, learning and small groups. They need volunteers to serve as small group leaders and storytellers.

Relevant: Relevant exists to give middle and high school students a place to belong and people that believe in them. They meet on Wednesday Nights at 6pm for Middle School and 7:30pm for High School. Relevant is often looking for small group leaders, cafe' workers, parking and security volunteers.

Thrive: Thrive is our ministry for Special Needs Kids. They are in need of volunteers with experience working with special needs kids or who are willing to go through the training.

Worship Team: This is a team of worshippers who sing and play to the glory of the Lord.

Tech Team: Our team that runs cameras, lights, sound and slides on Sunday mornings.
