The Story of the Bible || Freedom

Exodus 3:1-10

We spent the first couple of weeks of this series looking at God's creation and the fall of mankind. We have learned how God can use both good and bad experiences in our lives to teach us truths about Him.

- *What is an example of a good experience in your life that taught you more about God as well as a bad experience that you learned from?*

Read Exodus 3:1-10

- *Take a few minutes to look at chapters 1 and 2 so you have an idea of what has just happened before chapter 3*
- *What is the importance of God's first word, when speaking to Moses, was addressing him by his name?*

The Lord wants us to experience Him, He is interested in you. There is freedom in knowing the Lord and through the forgiveness of sin, we can have a personal relationship with Jesus. Remember that the overall theme to the Bible is God's redemption.

- *How do we see God's redemption in the story of Moses?*
- *How does it make you feel knowing that God wants to experience you personally, to interact with you, to be enjoyed by you?*

We can only have a personal relationship with God if we ask for forgiveness of our sins. Each of us have daily struggles that hinder us from knowing God more.

- *Think about that sin that is constantly in your face, preventing you from growing closer to God. Write it down and then spend some time praying and giving it to God. When you are done, tear it up and throw it away.*

It is easy for us to be enslaved by our sins. Even things that start off innocent can become a distraction in our lives that prevents us from experiencing God. The Lord wants you to be FREE!

- *As you go through your week, be aware of the things that occupy a lot of your time and ask yourself if it's coming between you and God. If it is, take the steps to correct that behavior and give it over to the Lord. Share with your spouse or a close friend and ask for accountability with those things. Do what needs to be done to deepen your relationship with Jesus and to live in that Freedom.*
