Small Groups Activites

1. Who Do You Say I Am?

What You Need: Bible marked at Matthew 16, "Who Do You Say I Am?" Activity Pages, scissors, glue sticks, crayons

What You Do:

- Give each child a "Who Do You Say I Am?" Activity Page.
- Invite a volunteer to open the Bible to Matthew 16.
- Guide kids to point to the first panel of the comic strip.
- Invite a volunteer to read the first question Jesus asked His disciples.
- Instruct kids to read the speech bubbles at the bottom of the page.
- Lead them to cut out the bubbles.
- Help kids glue the bubbles in sequence, referring to the numbers on the bubbles if needed.
- Provide as much help as necessary.
- When everyone finishes, "read" the story together.
- Kids can color the comic strip as time allows.

What You Say:

"Jesus asked His disciples the most important question anyone could ever ask! Do you remember what He asked? (Pause.) Yes! He asked them: Who do you say I am? (Matthew 15:16 NIrV) What did Peter say? (Pause.) Yes! Peter said, 'You're God's Son!'

"Some of you may know and believe that Jesus is the Savior and that He's God's Son, and some of you may have questions about Who He is. That's okay. No matter what you think about Jesus, you can talk with others about what you believe.

[Make It Personal] (Tell kids about a time you talked with someone about God. Tell how it helped you know Him more.)

"So, this week, find someone who loves Jesus and talk to them about what you believe. Ask questions and talk about things you don't understand. Because the more you talk about God, the more it helps you understand Who He is and how much He loves you. So, remember: [Bottom Line] you can TALK (cup your hands around your mouth, guiding kids to do what you do) with others about what you believe."

2. Prayer

What You Need: Index cards; markers

What You Do:

- Hand out index cards.
- Ask kids to think of someone they can talk with about what they believe.
- Set out the markers, and guide kids to write that person's name or draw a picture of that person on their index card.
- If time allows, invite kids to share their ideas.

What You Say:

"When you believe that Jesus really is God's Son, that He's alive, and that He died to save you from your sin, God forgives you. He erases your sin like it never happened. And when He does, you can have a close relationship with Him. You also have His promise that you'll live with Him forever! WOW!

[Make It Personal] (Briefly tell kids how you came to believe that Jesus is God's Son, how you asked Him to forgive your sin, and how you chose to follow Him. Tell them how following Jesus has made a difference in your life.)

[Bottom Line] "You can TALK with others about what you believe, too. You may not understand everything now, and that's okay. But if you'd like to talk with someone about what it means to believe in Jesus and follow Him, you can talk with me or someone you know who follows Jesus.

"But no matter what, always remember that God loves you more than you can imagine, and He wants to have a VERY special relationship with you! Let's pray."

(Lead kids in prayer, thanking God for sending Jesus to be our Savior. Ask God to help the kids—and you—know Him more.)

Connection Time

Use the following questions to keep the conversation going and to keep kids thinking about what they're learning!

- Can you talk with a snail about what you believe? (Nooo!) Can you talk with a mom about what you believe? (Yes!) Can you talk with a rock about what you believe? (No!) Can you talk with a grandparent about what you believe? (Yes!) Can you talk with a monkey about what you believe? (No!)
- Who do YOU say Jesus is? (He's really nice; He's kind; He's God's Son; He's my Savior!)
- Say: [Bottom Line] You can TALK) with others about what you believe!


